This year the Christmas Offering will be shared between The Cracked Pot and Community Cares.

The Cracked Pot's mission is "providing youth, who are aging out of foster care, new opportunities through Christ-centered community". The Cracked Pot Coffee Shop is located at 36 N. Hanover Street, Carlisle. The Cracked Pot provides employment, as well as other services and opportunities, to help young adults no longer in the foster care system to move forward with their lives. In addition to donations The Cracked Pot is also looking for volunteers to help with transportation and to help in the coffee shop.

Community Cares is currently renovating a building on Spring Garden Street to become their new emergency shelter and resource center. They hope to have the building completed within the next few months. This new shelter will provide much needed space for sleeping, eating, and work areas for the residents, as well as extra storage space, and the administration offices – bringing all the staff, volunteers and services for the residents all under one roof.

The Christmas Offering will help The Cracked Pot provide services to a very vulnerable group of young adults and help Community Cares to provide a larger and more efficient place to provide services to the homeless.

In November the Serve Team Shared Our Abundance and Sent:

- An additional \$2000 to Project Share to help with increased food insecurity due to SNAP disruption.
- \$500 to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to aid in relief for the Alaskan villagers effected by Typhoon Halong.
- \$1000 to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to aid in relief for the people of Jamaica effected by Hurricane Melissa.
- An additional donation of \$1000 to Safe Harbour to help pay their electric bill.
- \$311 for needed items to Domestic Violence Services of Cumberland & Perry Counties, which included paper towels, toilet paper, multipurpose cleaners, disinfectant sprays, laundry detergent, hand soap, body wash for adults, body wash for children, and trash bags.
- \$609 for totes, pots, and pans for the Welcome Home Kits given to the clients of Community Cares who are moving from homelessness to their own home.
- 124 items of clothing for the men and women of the Fruitbelt Farmworker Christian Ministry. We share this donation with the Presbyterian Women who allowed us to get much of the clothing from their October Whale of a Sale. Thanks to the Presbyterian Women for their compassion and generosity.

GUESS WHAT?! Bekah Barlow, Director of CYF Ministries, Has Been With Us for a Year!



And what a great year it has been! She has achieved three important first-year goals:

- 1. Reopen the Nursery for every Sunday use
- 2. Establish a Sunday morning program for elementary age children. This is what we know as SecondKids.
- 3. Ensure that all our background clearances for staff and volunteers up to date

She has done all this and more. A new child protection policy, called "Safe at Second," has been adopted by the Session. She hosted several family-oriented events. She is staging an all-new Nativity Play for Christmas Eve.

At the same time Shine! has grown to include up to 16 teens on a Sunday morning. And Michelle Trefren has created the Youth Arts Christian Choir. Meanwhile, KidsPraise and the PrayGround are going strong during worship.

The Session approved criteria to be considered by the Building Use Team when determining which outside groups are charged for using the facilities and what those charges should be.

Nepali Christian Churches are hosting an evangelism event at Second on December 6. We have been invited to attend!




