

The 2024 Easter Offering will be used to support Project SHARE'S Summer Feeding Program 4 Kids. Children and Youth is a priority for the Serve Team and Project SHARE's Summer Feeding Program 4 Kids is one way we carry out our mission. The program meets the needs of children and youth who no longer receive free or reduced-price meals when school is no longer in session.

This program saw a 33% increase from 2022 to 2023, feeding on average 570 kids weekly, translating to over 79,500 meals. That's 20,000 more meals from one summer to the next. Project SHARE is anticipating another increase due to the closing of a warehouse in March which affected 478 employees.

For children in PreK-18 years, Project SHARE provides healthy and easy-to-prepare breakfasts and lunches throughout the greater Carlisle area. The program runs from June to August and is a Drive-Thru Distribution model. Join the Serve Team in helping Project SHARE serve the children and youth in our community.

The leaders of the congregation are focused right now on a few major areas. One is ministry for Children, Youth, and Families. A 7-member task force has been formed to discover our strengths and determine what we need to build on them for the future. Everyone in the congregation will be invited to participate in the process. The outcome will be staffing recommendations and a slate of initiatives that are organic to Second Church. In the fall this process will be repeated with Adult Ministry. Another current area of Session focus is long-term Facilities budgeting. The Facilities Committee has several projects in mind (from repairing a shed to re-surfacing the parking lot) and we are planning now to accomplish these in the next few years.






